Dear Parents, Carers and Children,

Please encourage children to have a go at these extra-curricular opportunities and do remember to give permission for any club that your child may attempt. Next week will also see our sports fixtures beginning again and can I make an appeal now to return permission forms as quickly as possible. Finally, Outdoor School will also be starting again next week with visits to our three special sites being rotated around the four classes – parental support during these visits can be really useful so if you haven't already expressed your willingness to volunteer please let Mrs B know. 


