Dear parents, carers and children,

I hope you all had a lovely weekend and that you got to see some of the sunshine yesterday. There certainly seemed to be a lot of you enjoying yourselves on the open afternoon on Wednesday although there were a few watery eyes and held noses in Rinsey Class with their attempt to make a plastic substitute out of vinegar and milk!
