Dear parents, carers and children,

Here we go; the fast forward button has been pressed and we will now once again take on the challenge of Summer 2! We started off the term with a slightly less taxing four-day week but with assessments taking place in all year groups bar year 6 who had already undergone the ordeal of SATs it was still pretty intense. 
