CHARGING POLICY

The governors' charging policy states that we may ask for voluntary donations towards the cost of visits, workshops etc. We may also ask for a voluntary contribution for the cost of special materials such as cooking ingredients. These kinds of activities are expensive, but we do want them to be available for the children. Some of these activities can only be funded with the support of parents. When we write to request a voluntary contribution for an activity or visit, we may need to state that it can only go ahead if it is supported by voluntary contributions. If the activity goes ahead, no pupil will be excluded because their parents are unwilling or unable to go ahead.

We are very grateful that most parents do contribute towards these activities.

We do recognise that this can be expensive and try to keep the cost of such events as low as possible.

Parents are expected to pay for residential visits. Pupil premium may be used to subsidise camps for pupils who are eligible for this.

If parents find the residential trips prohibitive an application can be made to the headteacher which will be dealt with in full confidence.
