Dear parents, carers and children,

Today we are reminded of the real reason we became teachers: we love dressing up and have never really grown up. However, our efforts to impersonate our favourite stadium stars or invent a new persona of our own imagination paled into insignificance compared to the children's. From Kiss to Slash, Janis to Jimi; we had enough musicians to run our own Woodstock. Many including myself added a bit of variety with nods to musicians from other genres and there was certainly a good dose of punk hairstyles in the mix. This is only fitting as we have long celebrated the beautiful diversity that exists in music through our 'Musician of the Week' and do remember you are welcome to make suggestions if you think we have missed someone children should be exposed to. You can view a list of previous musicians attached to this newsletter. It was kindly compiled by Mrs Kent who still visits to help with the school's displays and is currently working on our musician display. To make the list she trawled back through all the newsletters we have archived in folders so there may be a few missed weeks but it is pretty comprehensive and thank you once again for supporting us Mrs Kent.

The reason we are all dressed as rock stars is to launch our new maths online support programme; 'Times Table Rockstars'. Mrs Haddy, who now coordinates maths across the school, thought it would be good to have another way of learning multiplication facts in a fun way and it certainly seems a hit with many members of her class who have been piloting the programme. It is now a national expectation for schools to try and teach all times table facts up to 12×12 by the end of year 4 and for once I strongly agree with the rationale behind this drive (although once facts up to 10×10 are learnt I think time is better spent developing the skill to partition and calculate any two-digit by single digit product e.g., $14 \times 6 = 10 \times 6 + 4 \times 6$). What cannot be denied is that so much of maths is dependent on knowledge of multiplication facts; to be able to divide you need to know them, to convert fractions you need to know them, to calculate area you need to know them etc. etc. All children (except EYFS) will now have logins for the Times Table Rockstars website and can practise as and when they want.

We will still continue to award 'Karate Bands' for achieving each times table but hopefully this will make it more fun to learn them. Remember, that your child also has a login for Mathletics which has many games and incentives to learn and is much broader than the Rockstars website, covering all aspects of the primary maths curriculum. Mathletics also has online teaching tutorials so if there is an area of maths your child is struggling with but you are not sure how to support you can go on the site and watch videos of how to approach particular problems. Remember also, that the school's <u>calculation policy</u> can be found on the website (under policies tab). It was created by our previous maths coordinator, Miss Shaw, and is extremely comprehensive. She used her technical wizardry to have the children themselves demonstrate the strategies that we teach to approach different operations in different year groups; unfortunately, a few of the clips do not now link and we will sort that soon but it should still be pretty clear. Finally on the subject of maths and home support; for those of you that have limited devices to access the internet we do have some in school that we can loan out and if you are unable to access the internet at all or prefer not to have too much screen exposure we can print paper booklets for home practice using Mathletics – just ask your teacher if you would prefer it this way.

We do hope that you will find some time to take advantage of any of the resources described and there is no doubt that, as with all 'fact based' learning, little and often is the key to success and regular revisiting is vital; just because a times table is learnt it doesn't mean the associated facts have been embedded in the long-term memory. Having said all of that we would not want maths practice to be at the expense of reading at home which is still the most important support you can give but hopefully it will give some variety for you all. Right time to line up some tunes for this afternoon's assembly – catch me at the gate if you want to suggest a musician and have a great weekend whatever you do.
