tales with this week being devoted to the twelve labours of Herakles. However, my favourite moment with the class came yesterday when I took the class for the last ten minutes to cover Mrs Gilroy. I arrived to see some brilliant artistic and thoughtful work linked to the tale of Pandora's jar with

children drawing the escaping negative forces but with a modern twist so children thought of things such as corona virus, climate change and negative feelings such as jealousy; an English, history, art

Their science work has also incorporated ICT as they used power-points with hyperlinks to explain how night and day are formed, why we have opposite seasons in the northern and southern hemispheres and why we see different phases of the moon. They are often concepts that are learnt and then later confused so be sure to keep checking on their understanding with a little quiz at home. On the subject of homework I have seen more brilliant examples from all classes and was particularly warmed by the random acts of kindness lists that have been shared with me this week.

On Tuesday, showing prospective new parents around, I was delighted to see members of Poldhu having a great time learning in the water play area. There was some excellent talk around capacity and further mathematical concepts of equality and weight were explored by filling buckets on either side of their giant scales. Their story about the aliens that love underpants is now becoming increasingly familiar and many should be able to retell the first half to you using the storyboard on the website. They have been creating their own traps to capture any other aliens that decide to visit the school so we should be safe for now.

Keeping safe and looking after ourselves was our PSHE theme this week and formed the focus of our assemblies. As part of this both me and Mrs Eustice spoke about the importance of internet safety in our assemblies this week. While doing so I remembered that it is a while since we reminded you all as parents about our subscription to the National Online Safety Association and the benefits that it gives to you as parents. A letter will be sent out today and I urge you all to take the time to read it. I am having to look further ahead for a weekly weather prediction (writing on Thursday as in hospital tomorrow finally having a metal plate removed from my arm) but it looks like a cloudy but dry affair so no reason to be stuck inside on the internet anyway!
