Dear Parents, Carers and Children,

We have been well and truly battered by the elements this week and with the exception of Wednesday been forced inside all week. Members of Kynance Class came to me on Tuesday with a possible solution to get them outdoors: After learning more about their topic focus country of Brazil they thought that a school trip to Rio would really help them immerse themselves in their learning.
