Dear Parents, Carers and Children,

Welcome back – Let the sparks fly! It doesn't feel to me like such a long time since we were in school but it feels like another lifetime when we were in here together as a real community properly sharing experiences together. As a team of staff we spent the Monday and Tuesday INSET days reminding ourselves of what we do best and we have every intention of returning to that with a bang. Teachers had already begun to plan for this at the end of last term and Topic overviews can be found on the website together with homework sheets (not for Poldhu this half term) to allow you to get involved with learning at home (Note: on the homework sheet that reading with your child at home is the single most important thing you can do to support us). Before I talk about the learning planned for each class however; a few reminders about practices and procedures:

- Thank you all for not parking on the yellow lines outside the school and please keep doing this even as the weather turns more autumnal.
- Drop off is back to our old time slot 8.40 9.00 you can drop off anytime within this period and children are expected to go straight into class register will close shortly after 9.00.
- We have an 'open door' policy but teachers or TA's can obviously not give much time for meetings at the start of the day when they are welcoming 30 children into class a quick memo is fine but if you need to discuss something at length let Mrs B know at the office and the class teacher will arrange to meet you as soon as possible.
- Clubs will begin again next week please ensure that club slips are returned if you intend to take advantage of them. With the exception of John Muir Club, clubs will end at 4.10.
 - At pick up time you are all welcome into the playground and there is no need to stay in separate 'bubbles' although we would advise sensible social distancing bearing in mind the current Covid situation in Cornwall. After school time some of you socialise for a short time which is lovely to see but please be aware that you are then responsible for your child's welfare and should supervise them, particularly if they are on the climbing equipment and they should never be out of your field of vision.
- After consultation we are continuing to have a relaxed practical uniform policy so children can wear own clothes suitable for doing PE and physical outdoor activities in but they should all have a school jumper/cardigan and a school polo shirt or T shirt for when the weather is warm (there's still chance yet). We will review our policy in the new year and give more specific guidance then.
- With respect to Covid and isolation procedures, as before if your child has symptoms https://www.nhs.uk/conditions/coronavirus-covid-19/symptoms/. Also be aware that as new variants appear symptoms for these may change https://covid.joinzoe.com/post/new-top-5-covid-symptom. You should inform us and keep them off school until they have a PCR test result if negative they can return straight away if positive they isolate for 10 days. If someone in the same household tests positive children in the household can still come to school but it is advised that all members of the household get PCR tests. The school no longer has a duty to track and trace and will not inform you if there have been positive cases in the school unless thresholds to 'step up' preventative measures are met. Currently the guidance is that if we have more than 5 confirmed positive cases within the school we are to consider reapplying previous measures such as separate learning bubbles.
