Student displaying symptoms of Coronavirus	if a child, young person or other learner becomes unwell with symptoms of coronavirus while in their setting and needs direct personal care until they can return home, they will be moved to an isolated area which will be ventilated as much as possible. Parents to be contacted immediately and ask for child to be removed from school site. A fluid-resistant surgical face mask should be worn by the supervising adult if a distance of 2 metres cannot be maintained. If contact with the child or young person is necessary, then disposable gloves, a disposable apron and a fluid-resistant surgical face mask should be worn by the supervising adult. If a risk assessment determines that there is a risk of splashing to the eyes, for example from coughing, spitting, or vomiting, then eye protection should also be worn. Follow advice in section 7 of Dfe advice detailing engagement with track test and trace process. As with Dfe advice children will not be made to wear face coverings but the driver will. Parents dropping off will leave children at the school gate (exception being EYFS children for the first 2 weeks whilst they acclimatise to school) where headteacher will be stationed to direct them to appropriate doorway for their bubble where a staff member will be waiting. Social distancing not maintained in school corridors

Due to width of corridor travel along corridors to be minimised; children to leave and enter school in single file 2m apart at start/end of the day and for break/lunch times. Children to travel to toilets one at a time. Classrooms used both have immediate access to the outdoors. Children to be aware that they only need to use the corridors if essential and permission to be asked from staff member. As with all hazards related to social distancing children will be given constant reminders about the importance of maintaining social distancing and personal hygiene. This will be re-enforced with appropriate signage around the whole building and appropriate behaviours will be positively reenforced with praise and reward Revised Control measure: Due to physicality of the school building and children's ability to constantly observe social distancing it is believed that this does present a medium risk if coronavirus rates were at a dangerous level and the school is only opening due to the advice of the DfE that the R rate is sufficiently low for schools to attempt to manage a return.
