UNIFORM

The uniform policy that Gwinear School has adopted is set out below:

Footwear – Trainers suitable for doing physical exercise in. Trainers should have appropriate grip for outdoors (plimsols or other footwear with no tread are not suitable). These shoes are the only ones necessary as children can wear them in class, at break and when doing PE and must be school at all times. If you choose to send your child into school in more traditional shoes you may do so, but they must have the trainers to get changed into. It is also necessary for your child to have a pair of wellies in school for use on really wet days in line with the schools outdoor learning ethos. However, the school does have a large range available in several sizes should this be a problem.

Where you can source – Most large supermarkets have a range of cheap but reasonable quality trainer/shoes as do most sports or shoe shops.

Legwear – Plain dark (navy, grey or black) shorts/trousers/leggings/skirt/skort etc, suitable for doing physical activity in. Jeans are not appropriate and try to avoid fabrics that will get very heavy in wet conditions.

Where you can source - any high street or supermarket clothes provider.

Upper body wear – A school coloured (royal blue) polo shirt and/or t shirt and a school coloured (royal blue) sweatshirt, fleece, jumper or cardigan. These items do not need to be branded with the school logo although we would like children to have at least one branded top for when they are representing the school.

It is also acceptable for children to wear blue checked dresses particularly in the summer. It is best to have a pair of shorts in school or wear under the dress for PE.

Where you can source – Royal blue tops can be found in most large supermarkets and other clothes shops. The branded tops are available from Trophy Textiles (the school has checked this supplier is price competitive with other supplies in the area).

Coat – A warm and preferably water-resistant coat for being outside, any colour. The school has a full set of waterproof tops in a range of sizes for outdoor learning to protect against rain but they do not provide much insulation.

Where you can source - most large supermarkets and high street shops.

Sports *Kit* – As stated there is no need for a separate PE kit if your child is dressed as described, although you are welcome to have one if you wish – in school colours.

- Your child will need a swimming costume for swimming lessons no colour restriction.
- When representing the school, we will provide children with appropriate "team strip" except when competing in the swimming galas.
- Certain sports will need some advisory and/or necessary extra clothing/footwear such as shin pads and studded boots for football. These are not necessary or indeed used in curriculum PE time and you will be informed if they are necessary for extra curricula activity.

Provision of second-hand uniform – at the end of every term a message will be sent to all parents alerting them to a time, usually straight after school, when all second- hand uniform that has been given to the school will be displayed. These items will be offered free of charge and will be available to all parents – we ask that parents are considerate of others when choosing what to take. If parents are struggling to finance uniform they are encouraged to contact the office and we will allow access to this resource in confidence.

With this practical approach we hope to maximise learning time with no need to change for different activities and minimise the cost to parents.

NOTE: Every year many items go astray and it is so much easier to re-home them if all clothing is clearly labelled with children's names.
